Year 4: Alex for excellent behaviour for learning. Leo N for his enthusiasm and engagement in class discussions.


Year 5: Eliot for an excellent piece of writing. Cora for being a great historical investigator.

Year 6: James and Bobby for perfect behaviour for learning and excellent contributions to lessons. Winning Team this week are Team Hodder


Are you looking for support for your child's wellbeing? The following books were shared with us at a recent training event attended by our teaching staff:

Competition Time:

Bobbies on a Bauble Competition – Lancashire Constabulary invite all pupils to enter their Christmas Competition to design a Christmas e-card.

This year's theme is 'Bobbies on a Bauble' and designs must include a policing element on our template of a Christmas bauble. This could include a police officer, dogs, cars, horses or police symbols like the crest, checkered pattern or thin blue line.

You can take part as a Lancashire school or you can enter as an individual. Everyone has a chance to win, regardless of your age and ability. Be as creative, colourful and imaginative as you'd like - but all submissions must be hand drawn!

If you are unable to print out our template you can pick one up from receptions at Divisional HQs in Blackpool, Greenbank or Preston or create your own by simply drawing a circle for the design to go into.

There will be a winner and two runners-up. The winning design will be used for the Chief Constable's e-card to 5,000 officers and staff as well as partner agencies. All entries will be printed out and put on our Christmas tree in the reception at Hutton HQ.

The winning artist will receive an arts and crafts goodie bag, certificate and a £150 book voucher for their school. Two runners-up will be selected and receive an arts and craft goodie bag and certificate.

All entries must be received by the closing date of Wednesday 6th December by 23:59. Sadly, any entries received after the closing date/time will not be counted.

Twenty shortlisted entries will be put to the public vote via Instagram stories on Friday 8th December. The chosen 10 from this vote will be presented to the Chief Constable to choose the winner from.

Winners will be announced on the Constabulary's social media channels on Wednesday 13th December.
