Medical Reminder

We currently have a pupil in our school undergoing weekly Chemotherapy, which will be continuing until 2025. It is really important the family are made aware of any illnesses currently in school as treatment cannot happen when the pupil is ill. In addition common childhood illnesses can be serious, often resulting in hospital admission. Please ensure school is always informed as to why your child is absent (for example with Covid, stomach bug, chicken pox, Strep A, Scarlet Fever) If your child has had vomiting or diarrhoea, the guidance states they shouldn't attend school for 48hours after they were last ill, not from the start of the bug. Thank you for your support in keeping our vulnerable pupils safe.

On Thursday we had the great pleasure in taking seventeen of our amazing pupils to a swimming gala held at Hutton Grammar School.
