Hello, I am Angela Flint, and I am the Family Support Worker at Penwortham Primary School.

I have been a part of our School family and community for over twelve years. I currently work in the School as a Teaching Assistant and I support pupils with special educational needs or disabilities. For two days a week I also offer support to families within our school.

What does a Family Support Worker at Penwortham Primary School do?

Our aim is to work in partnership with you to ensure that all children enjoy school, are successful and are happy and secure in school and at home. I am here to listen, support and advise on any concerns. I will work with you for the best outcomes for your child and family.

How does it work?

If you have queries you would like to discuss, please email me or contact the school office and I will arrange a time to meet with you during school hours. (08.30-15.00). We can spend time discussing any worries or queries, and from that discussion we will work in partnership to put support in place. Support could be time for your child to talk/work with me in school, support strategies for the home, support from your child's class team, referral to the school learning mentor, referral to SENDCO, or signposting to other agencies who can offer support and guidance

Your Family Support Worker offers impartial support, advice and guidance to parents/carers.

- Parenting concerns
- School transition
- School attendance
- Relationship breakdown
- Bereavement
- Early intervention work
- Meetings with other agencies
- Managing challenging behaviour and setting boundaries
- Parents becoming more involved with their child's school and learning
