We had a special visit from the mad science team on Wednesday, the children had fun watching the experiments which the scientists demonstrated for everyone. Flyers on how to sign up to the afterschool club have now been sent home if your child would like to join this amazing STEM programme to explore the world of science in an interactive environment.

Following on from the school council care assembly on Tuesday all of the the children and staff were invited to dress in yellow on Thursday to show their support and raise awareness for World Mental Health Day 2024. Each class talked about how to keep their minds healthy and discussed what makes them happy.

Year 1 have been learning some new computing skills by practicing typing their names using a keyboard and drawing on the tables in maths learning how to create parts and wholes with counters.

Year 2 have been exploring different ways of showing gratitude on Thursday with the help of Mrs Vaja who explained the Hindu ritual of Puja. Mrs Vaja was also kind enough to share her own Puja tray with the children.

Year 3 have been using practical equipment in maths to represent, compare and count in numbers to 1000. The class also made some amazing abstract art with shading and sketching using different techniques.

Year 4 are top of the school scoreboard with their Emile spelling and are still the reining champions of 16 weeks unbeaten on TTRockstars. Year 5 have been demonstrating with biscuits in science to learn about the different phases of the moon.

Year 6 have learnt how a camel adapts to its environment with their long lashes, leather pads on their feet and how they store food in their hump!




## Amazing Achievement...









